#### Benefits & the V.A.

As far as the reduction of benefits being cut for veterans, I believe that is not the case throughout the V.A. system. What is happening and is being reported on the news sources is that some V. A. medical facilities are accused of manipulating waiting lists for veterans who wish to obtain medical services. The V.A. was striving to have medical appointments scheduled within 14 days and when that was proven to be difficult to achieve some people in the V.A. medical system have been accused of hiding some of those veterans on the waiting lists in order to make the waiting lists seem to be shorter than they actually were. I have been told by the V.A. medical staff that some of the people involved, in other states, have been dismissed and there is an ongoing investigation by the V.A. Inspector General's Office.

What is not involved in the current "scandal" is the rest of the V.A. programs such as Compensation-Pension, Education and the various other benefits available to veterans and qualified family members.
