The Veterans Employment & Education Division is responsible for ensuring that U.S. veterans have the opportunity to provide, with honor and dignity, the economic necessities of life for themselves and their families.



The American Legion Structure (cont.) Veterans Employment & Education Commission Purpose

- To supervise and coordinate all activities of committees assigned to the Veterans Employment & Education Commission;
- When necessary, to initiate action concerning all matters affecting the economic well-being of veterans and/or the re-establishment of all war veterans returning to civilian life after a period of active service in the Armed Forces of the United States;
- To keep the National Commander and the National Executive Committee informed concerning all developments affecting the economic welfare of veterans in all areas under the jurisdiction of the Veterans Employment & Education Commission;
- Such other purposes as may be assigned to it by the National Executive Committee.



The American Legion Structure (cont.) Veterans Employment & Education Committees:

- Employment & Veterans Preference Committee
- Veterans Education, Other Benefits & Homelessness Committee
- Veterans Employment and Education deals with programs involving veteran's education, small business, employment, veteran's preference, VA home loans, homeless veterans, training, licensing and certification, transition, USERRA, and other issues related to economics

The American Legion National Veterans Employment & Education Commission is still requesting that all Detachments form their own VE&E Committees/Commissions and then request that their Districts and Squadrons do the same. Several Detachments have already done so and we thank you.

These Committees can then assist us by going online and finding local job fairs being held in your states and communities. Then take this info, as well as info received from National HQ, and place it on your websites and Facebook pages and in your newsletters. You can also print out fliers that advertise these job fairs and post them on the bulletin board at your Posts and in other locations around your community where local Veterans will see them.

- ▶ In addition, We are sure that you will agree that no Veteran should ever be homeless. However, Veterans Homelessness does exist in all corners of our nation.
- ► First Responders are often times in contact with these down on their luck Veterans on a daily basis. The VA has created a brochure to assist these First Responders in dealing with and assisting these homeless Veterans.

VA Helps Veterans ...

Stay healthy

 Eligible Viceans can receive health care, including mental health care and treatment for substance use.

Secure safe, stable housing

- Voterans at risk of becoming homeless can get assistance with expenses such as utilities and child care to help them stay in their homes.
- Qualified Veterans in temperary housing can get help finding a permanent home.
- VA can help Veterans having trouble making mortgage payments explore octions to avoid forecessure

Find a job

- Vh provides job maning or referrals to help eligible Veterans gain skills to propure them for employment.
- Work therapy programs can help letterans who are homeless find temporary flouring and a paying job.

Get a degree

 VA can help eligible Veterans go back to school and assist with living expenses while they pursue their studies.

VA provides individualized care through a wide range of services for Veterans who are homeless or at imminent risk of becoming homeless, Veterans of all eras and branches may be eligible for VA services. Make the Call and take the first step to access help from VA.



In 2017, Jeremy "Bull" and Robert "Bobby" Carver had the idea to hold a fundraiser in celebration of Jeremy's 21st birthday. The event, a Texas Hold'em poker game, was hosted at American Legion Post 19 in Gardner, KS.

The event was so successful, Jeremy and Bobby decided to repeat it the following year. In 2018, "Hold'Em for Heroes" raised over \$12,000 with proceeds benefiting <u>Veterans Community Project</u>. During that event, Jeremy and VCP co-founder Vincent Morales learned they did two tours together in Iraq (2004 and 2007) with the 25th Infantry Division.

> SUGGESTED RESPONSIBILITIES FOR A DETACHMENT VE&E COMMITTEE/COMMISSION

- ▶ COORDINATE WITH SAL NATIONAL VE&E COMMISSION
- ► COORDINATE WITH DEPARTMENT VE&E COMMISSION OR EQUIVALENT (SUCH AS EMPLOYMENT)
- ► DISSEMINATE INFORMATION PROVIDED BY THE VE&E COMMISSION ON THE STATE AND NATIONAL LEVELS TO DISTRICTS, COUNTIES, SQUADRONS.
- ► IDENTIFY THE ACTIVE COMMUNITY BASED VETERAN SERVICE ORGANIZATIONS/PROVIDERS IN YOUR AREAS AND THEIR NEEDS.
- ► EDUCATE YOURSELVES AND YOUR MEMBERS ON VETERANS HOMELESSNESS IN YOUR AREAS SO YOU MAY EDUCATE OTHERS.
- ▶ PROMOTE LOCAL BUSINESSES THAT HIRE VETERANS.
- ► HOLD A FUND RAISER AND MAKE A DONATION TO A VETERAN'S SERVICE ORGANIZATION OR PROVIDER.
- ► CONTACK LOCAL OFFICIALS TO SEE WHAT IS BEING DONE TO END VETERAN HOMELESSNESS BECOME AN ADVOCATE.
- ► IN SHORT THERE ARE NUMEROUS WAYS THAT YOUR DETACHMENT CAN ADVOCATE FOR, ASSIST AND PROMOTE VETERANS EMPLOYMENT AND EDUCATION.



Recommended activities for detachments and squadrons could include but would not be limited to:

- Attend meetings and conference calls of the national VE&E Commission,
- Coordinate with your respective department VE&E Commission to assist in job/career fairs, homeless stand-downs or other events,
- Disseminate information provided by the VE&E Commissions on the state and national level to district, county and squadron levels,
- Identify the active community-based Veterans Service Providers in your areas,
- Educate yourselves and your members on veteran homelessness so you may educate others.
- Promote local businesses to hire veterans.
- Hold a fundraiser/make a donation to a veteran outreach program / VOLUNTEER,
- Contact local officials to see what is being done to end veteran homelessnessbecome an advocate.

While it is the responsibility of the commission to pass along as much information as possible, the success of the VE&E commission will be dependent on detachments and squadrons with "boots on the ground" at the local levels.
