

The S.A.L. Detachment of Texas Finance Committee met in the Amphitheatre of the Austin South Park Hotel at 10:15 a.m. on September 23, 2023. The committee members consisted of George Alva; Chairman, Jon Kingston; PDC, Stephen Slaughter; Finance Officer, Henry Creech; Legion Advisor, Kevin Winkelmann; Detachment Adjutant, and David Blair.

The proposed 2023-2024 budget had been previously approved by the committee. It was presented to The American Legion Americanism Committee and The American Legion Finance Committee by Henry Creech. Both groups approved the budget as well.

Throughout the fiscal year, the S.A.L. had enough money to complete necessary projects. After some minor expenses we had an income surplus of \$23,231. 25% (\$5,800.) was donated to the Thom Skelley campaign fund. \$1,000.00 was donated to the Central Texas Food Bank; an American Legion Auxiliary and YMCA program.

Baseball was discussed and Henry Creech moved to make a one-time donation of \$500.00 to the baseball program. A second was given and after brief discussion the motion passed unanimously. It was agreed to pay Detachment Adjutant Kevin Winkelmann \$200.00 for the work he does for the Detachment. He will be classified as a 1099 contractor rather than as an employee.

It was agreed by the committee members that the Detachment Convention registration fee for squadron commanders will be waived at the next Detachment Convention.

Overall, the Detachment S.A.L. is in a very good financial position with the account being well in the black.

The committee meeting adjourned at 10:40 a.m. and was presented, after the lunch break, by the committee chairman to all the S.A.L. members in attendance.
