How are you commemorating Veterans Day?

Veterans Day has its origins at the end of World War I, when at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918, the fighting ended with the signing of an armistice.

- The SAL and local Scouts in Northumberland, Pa., will handle flag removal at Riverview Cemetery after the Post 44 Legion Family's Veterans Day Service on Nov. 13.
